PUBLIC COMMENTS

Jonett Haberfield, Visit Fairfield County, thanked Kimber for arranging the loan of models (covered bridges, Stonewall Cemetery, Rock Mill) to them for display. She said they like to tell visitors that Fairfield County has the most *original* covered bridges in Ohio. Although Ashtabula County has more bridges, some of those are new constructions, not originals. Even without the Shade and Hummel bridges, Fairfield County still has more originals.

COMMITTEE UPDATES

Smeck-FCATC

Kimber reported there have been two meetings with members of Fairfield County Antique Tractor Club, one in May, one in June, to establish regular communication with FCATC, discuss what was to be planted at Smeck Park, and to get a schedule of farming activities for upcoming Harvest Celebration! 2022.

STAFF REPORTS

Marcey Shafer, Director

There were no questions or comments about her report.

Miranda Cain, Education Specialist

Marcey added that just last week there was a productive meeting with Education staff in which they discussed coordinating effort with volunteers, working on seasonal and annual goals, tracking results, etc.

Chad Reed, Operations Coordinator

Marcey explained FCPD is hosting Earth Camp 2022 (June 14-16). Chad and Alex have been working hard to get the park ready for this event. Chris has been documenting issues with other parks, such as Flight of the Hawk Park.

Jeffrey Feyko confirmed that Chad's report includes information from the two Park Technicians' worklogs.

Kimber Caito, Media Coordinator

Kimber said she had put Rock Mill Days ads in publications that are just now appearing to the public. The ads had to be submitted months in advance, long before it was known that Rock Mill would have to be closed for repairs.

Wahkeena Nature Preserve (Tom Shisler & Nora Steele)

Marcey stated we may get a contracted person to help with school groups next year so that Miranda can focus on programs at other park locations.

CREDIT CARD EXPENSES

Review of Credit Card Statement

Jeffrey Feyko asked about the charge to Dill's Greenhouse. Ginger explained those were for fruit trees that were planted at Smeck Park and that a county resident made a donation to cover that amount.

OLD BUSINESS

C&O Railway Caboose, Joint Venture with Hocking Valley Enterprises, Update

Marcey said a letter addressed to Sugar Grove's mayor is ready to be mailed. She explained the purpose of the letter is to advise him of the caboose maintenance fund and regarding the ownership issue. There was a brief discussion about the purpose and origination of the fund and the move of the caboose proposed by Lew Barbini, Hocking Valley Enterprises.

Permanent Restroom at Smeck Park

Ginger reported there was a construction update meeting Thursday last week. The heavy rains have delayed construction but, over the weekend, some of the flooring was poured.

Covered Bridges (Shade and Hummel) Misty Valley Park

Marcey mentioned there was an article written by NBC4i.com about the salvage/demolition of the bridges at Misty Valley Park. Jeffrey Feyko asked Kimber to send a link to that article to Board members.

Repairs at Rock Mill

Marcey reported the engineer said he is about done with the proposed plan for repairs to Rock Mill and will submit it within the next two weeks. A bid packet will be prepared. Then, it will go out to bid.

Mambourg Park Updates

Marcey said most of the new permanent trail wayfinding signs have been installed. Text for nature center exhibits has been drafted for review. She said she has contacted ODOT regarding expansion of the main parking lot and will have more information soon.

Amanda Bike Trail

Marcey stated no one has returned her call about the trail relocation. Ginger explained there are three easements owned by FCPD.

Marcey said that she wants to learn more about bike trail creation and partnerships. So, the is going tomorrow to a meeting with the Rails-to-Trails group where she hopes to learn more about their process.

Zeller Contract

Joshua Horacek stated Amy Brown-Thompson is working on the contract.

NEW BUSINESS

Sensory Trail

Marcey stated renewal of the lease is to be discussed today during Executive Session.

Flight of the Hawk Park

Marcey reminded the Board that the park is being used as a park-n-ride and there are few legitimate park visitors. Between May 23 and June 12, for example, during numerous checks

by staff, only three people were seen inside the park despite there being many cars in the lot. There was a brief discussion about the misuse of the park.

Jonett explained VFC promotes the hawk statue and park. She stated many tourists recognize the hawk as a sign that they are almost at their destination, the Hocking Hills area. She suggested adding signage along US-33 pointing to the park, such as there is for Wahkeena Nature Preserve.
